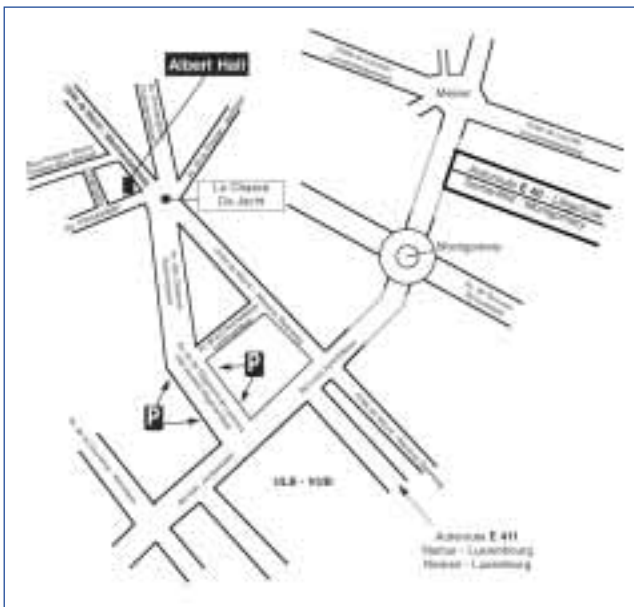

## Abstract Competition

All submitted abstracts will have to be presented as a poster at the Annual Meeting.

If the poster has already been presented at another occasion, the original format may be used unchanged at the SARB meeting.

The jury will be composed of the international faculty and the members of the scientific committee.

Two categories are proposed: clinical and experimental. The authors of the abstract will indicate their choice for one of the two categories. If no choice is indicated, the chairman of the scientific committee will indicate the category. The best abstract presented by a resident will be given the Resident Award, which enters the abstract automatically for the ESA Resident Award competition.

Each member of the jury will rank the abstracts. The abstract with the best overall ranking will win the competition. Abstracts will not be blinded.

All abstracts must be submitted to the SARB secretariat before Saturday, 9 October, 2004.
